# Good afternoon and welcome to the first ever EPIC Showcase!

For seven years Silk Road Rising has been working with 6th-12th grade Chicago Public School (CPS) students on the EPIC (Empathic Playwriting Intensive Course). This school year we want to take the opportunity to highlight some of the creative, brilliant, and savvy CPS students we have the pleasure of working with last semester. Over the course of twenty in-classroom sessions, EPIC students work with a Silk Road Rising teaching artist to discover how to tell stories and practice empathy by writing a short play. The students make connections and build trust through theatre games and activities that encourage them to think outside themselves and look at the world through other perspectives.

Many of our students have limited exposure to theatre and almost no exposure to playwriting. We guide students to self-empowerment by giving them the tools to become confident storytellers and creative problem solvers through the act of writing a play. Underestimating student voice is common among our communities and sometimes their stories get stifled and go unheard. However, we believe the voices of the students are sometimes the most important and enlightening voices in the room. Come with us on a journey of community fellowship as we give space for the student voice to rise.

We would like to thank the more than 500 students who participate in EPIC annually and to congratulate our seven playwrights who have been selected for the EPIC Showcase. They are proudly representing Crown Community Academy, Oscar DePriest Elementary, John Hancock College Prep, Kelvyn Park High School, and Turner-Drew Elementary.
