These playwriting skills stay with them so that over time, participants can develop more stories.

Showcase! For seven years Silk Road Rising has been working with 6th-12th grade Chicago Public School (CPS) students in the EPIC (Empathic Playwriting Intensive

Good afternoon and welcome to the spring EPIC

Course). This year we have expanded our reach to the older adult community and, for the first time, offered EPIC+ at Brookdale Lake Shore Drive, Senior Living. From 6th grade to lifelong learners, EPIC is helping people tell their stories citywide.

This year we want to take the opportunity to highlight some of the creative, brilliant, and savvy CPS students and lifelong learners we have the pleasure of working with from February to now. Over the course of twenty sessions, EPIC students work with a Silk Road Rising teaching artist to discover how to tell stories and practice empathy by writing a short play or monologue. The students make connections and build trust through theatre games and activities that encourage them to think beyond themselves and look at the world through other perspectives.

Many of our CPS students have limited exposure to theatre and almost no exposure to playwriting, while our lifelong learners have so many stories to tell and need a unique way to share them. We guide students to self-empowerment by giving them the tools to become confident storytellers and creative problem solvers through the act of writing a play or monologue. Underestimating student voice is common among our communities and sometimes their stories get stifled and go unheard. Similarly, the older adult voice is all too often ignored or not taken seriously. However, we believe these voices are sometimes the most important and enlightening voices in the room. Come with us on a journey of community fellowship as we give space for these voices to rise.

We would like to thank the more than 500 students who participate in EPIC annually and to our first EPIC+ class at Brookdale. We congratulate our playwrights who have been selected for the EPIC Showcase. They are proudly representing Brookdale Lake Shore Drive, Columbia Explorers Academy, Galileo Scholastic Academy, Skinner West Elementary, Solorio High School, Wells Community Academy High School, and Westcott Elementary.
