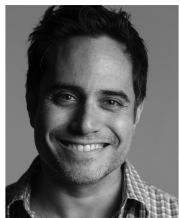

**Rajiv Joseph** (Playwright) wrote *Bengal Tiger at the Baghdad Zoo* (a 2010 finalist for the Pulitzer Prize), *Huck and Holden*, *Gruesome Playground Injuries*, *Animals Out of Paper*, *The Monster at the Door*, and *The North Pool*. He is the book-writer and co-lyricist for the upcoming musical, *Fly*, adapted from JM Barrie's novel, *Peter Pan*. Rajiv Joseph received his BA in Creative Writing from Miami University and his MFA in Playwriting from NYU's Tisch School of the Arts. He served for three years in the Peace Corps in Senegal, West Africa.



**Timothy Douglas** (Director) Previous Chicago credits include *Etiquette of Vigilance* at Steppenwolf, and *Mourning Becomes Electra* and *Changes of the Heart* at Remy Bumppo. 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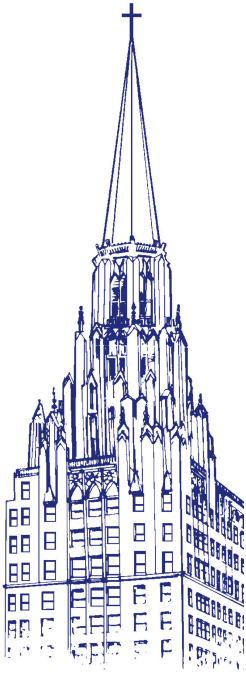
