Karim Nagi (Writer and Performer) is a native Egyptian, a drummer, a DJ, a composer, and a folk dancer. He is the creator of *Turbo Tabla* and has released four internationally distributed CDs of his unique brand of Arab House/Electronica using acoustic instruments. He is well versed in the ultra-traditional styles of music and has lead the Sharq Arabic Music Ensemble since 1999. He promotes and fosters the study of Arab dance in the USA as the director of Arab Dance Seminar. Karim performs and teaches Tahteeb Cane Dance, Dabka Line Dance, and Zikr Sufi Dance. He taught at the New England Conservatory of Music for five years, and has lectured and presented at Harvard, MIT, Yale, Bowdoin, Princeton, Stanford, William & Mary, Georgetown, and several community colleges. His performances boast a dynamic concoction of live drumming and dance, done in unison. Karim Nagi is a true crossover artist, uniting the cabaret and tribal, traditional and the modern, the ethnic and the urban.



Anna C. Bahow (Director) is committed to the development of new work and a diversity of voices. She feels privileged to continue her collaboration with Silk Road Rising having previously directed *INVASION!* and *Ziryab: Songbird of Andalusia*, and numerous workshops and readings. She also directed and traveled for Silk Road Rising to London, England and Toronto and Vancouver, Canada in 2016 and 2017. She is pleased to be part of this joint venture between Stage Left Theatre (where she has directed workshops and readings) and Silk Road Rising. Other theatres that she has worked with include: The Side Project, City Lit, Rasaka, Collaboraction, Timeline and others. # STATEMENT FROM JAMIL KHOURY FOUNDING ARTISTIC DIRECTOR, SILK ROAD RISING

For some 35 years, I have engaged with wonderfully well-intentioned individuals who have embarked on a quest to "make sense" of the Arab World. Typically, their process would begin with an attempt at cataloging, at sorting through who's who and what's what. Inevitably, they'd throw up their arms and wave the white flag. "It's too complicated," they'd bemoan. To which I'd think to myself, "No more complicated than a federal republic comprised of 50 states and people from all corners of the planet."

Yes, our contemporary thinking demands that all things complex be broken down into bite-size, digestible pieces, and that's exactly what master storyteller and musician Karim Nagi does. But he does so with sophistication, depth, humor, and wit. *Detour Guide* is no "Arab World for Dummies." It's Arab World for those who wish to be enlightened, challenged, and entertained, created by an artist whose Americanness and Arabness are lovingly bound and exceedingly curious.



# STATEMENT FROM ANNALIESE MCSWEENEY DRAMATURG

To me, music is such an accessible aspect of a culture because even if hearing a beat for the first time, it can reach out and touch our souls. Coming to this story as an outsider, I love that Karim uses the image of his drum as our passport to his tourists' detour. Karim specifically chose an Egyptian *tabla* drum to guide us on our journey because it is authentic to his experiences and its essence is present across the countries he shows us in the play. In this sense, the drum is a unifying symbol; but as Karim tailors the beat and scale to each of the encounters he shares with us, he emphasizes the unique and diverse identities that he invites us to explore within the Arab world. This is the heart of what he wants to show us and the tabla provides a heartbeat to his story.
